What Keno is used for

Keno is used for the adjunctive treatment and for the temporary relief of symptoms associated with oral inflammation or ulcer resulting from trauma.

How Keno works

The sticky paste will stick to the wet surfaces of the mouth and form a protective film over your mouth ulcer.

Before you use Keno

- When you must not use it
- Have bacterial, fungal, or viral infections of the mouth or throat
- Hypersensitive to any of the ingredients in Keno.

- Before you start to use it

Please inform the doctor:

• If substantial improvement does not occur after 7 days of treatment

If you are not sure whether you should start taking this product, consult your doctor.

- Taking other medicines

Tell your doctor if you are taking any other medicine, including any that you buy without a prescription. You may need to use different amounts of these medicines, or you may need to take different medicines. Your doctor will advise you.

- Pregnancy and lactation

The use of this preparation during pregnancy has not been established. Therefore, it is advisable to ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking any medication.

How to use Keno

Follow all directions give to you by your doctor and pharmacist carefully. They may differ from the information contained in this leaflet. If you do not understand the instructions on the label, ask your doctor or pharmacist for help.

- How much to use

Squeeze a small amount of Keno onto a clean wet cotton bud and apply gently on the affected area, without rubbing until a thin film develops.

- When to use it

Apply at bed time and if necessary, 2 or 3 times daily after meals, or apply as directed by the doctor or pharmacist.

- How long to use it

Continue taking Keno for as long as your doctor recommends.

- If you forget to use it

Consult your doctor or pharmacist on what you should do if you forget to use it.

Take the missed dose as soon as you remember. If it is almost time for your next dose, wait until then to take the medicine and skip the missed dose. Do not take a double dose to make up for the missed dose.

- If you use too much (overdose)

Contact your doctor immediately or go to the Emergency Department of your nearest hospital, if you think you or anyone else may have taken too of this medicine. Do this even if there are no signs of discomfort of poisoning. You may need urgent medical attention.

While you are using it

- Things you must do
- Tell your doctor or pharmacist immediately if you notice any side effects, or if the side effects gets serious or anything else that make you feel unwell.
- If you become pregnant, or plan on becoming pregnant while using Keno, tell your doctor immediately.
- If you are about to be started on a new medicine, remind your doctor and pharmacist that you are using Keno.

- Things you must not do
- Do not use Keno after the expiry date which is stated on the carton and tube.
- Do not use stop taking your medicines without consulting your doctor.
- Do not give this medication to anyone else, even if they have the same condition as you.

- Things to be careful of

Do not drive or use machines if you feel unwell. Contact your doctor immediately.

Side effects

Side effects are unlikely when used as recommended. However, there is a possibility when used over a long period of time. Intolerance to Keno is very rare.

If you notice any irritation or other side effects such as weakness or dizziness, which you think may be as a result of using this product, stop treatment and consult your doctor or pharmacist.

Storage and Disposal of Keno

Storage

Store in a cool dry place, below 30°C. Keep out of the reach of children.

- <u>Disposal</u>

Medicines should not be disposed of via wastewater or household water. Ask your pharmacist how to dispose of medicines no longer required. These measure will help to protect the environment.
