

PRIME'S ACRIFLAVINE CREAM

Acriflavine (0.1% w/w)

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What Acriflavine is used for

For treatment of infected wounds, cuts or burns, and for skin disinfection.

How Acriflavine works

Acriflavine is used to kill bacteria which causes infection in wounds or burns.

Before you use Acriflavine

- When you must not use it
- allergic to acriflavine or other ingredients of the product.

- Before you start to use it

Caution when using near the eyes as it may cause irritation. Inform the doctor if pregnant or breast-feeding. Prolonged treatment may delay healing.

- Taking other medicines

The medicine is for topical application, usually will have minimal effect on other medications. However, please inform the doctor or pharmacist if taking other medicines.

How to use Acriflavine

- How much to use

Apply to the affected area or on suitable gauze dressing and renew daily if required.

- When to use it

Please follow the advice of the doctor or pharmacist.

- How long to use it

You should check with your doctor or pharmacist.

- If you forget to use it

If forget to use this medicine, use it as soon as remember. Then next, use this medicine at the usual time.

- If you use too much (overdose)

If used too much *Acriflavine*, contact your doctor, an emergency department or a poisoning center immediately.

While you are using Acriflavine

- Things you must do

Inform doctor of medications you are taking.

- Things you must not do

Do not stop using medication although you feel better after a few days. Continue until the prescribed course is finished.

- Things to be careful of

If pregnant or become pregnant or breast-feeding during treatment, you should not use Acriflavine unless doctor advised.

Side effects

No reported adverse effects caused by acriflavine. However, it may cause photosensitivity in some patients. If any of the side effects become serious or any other side effects not listed in this leaflet, please inform the doctor or pharmacist. Storage and Disposal of Acriflavine

- Storage

Store in cool, dry place below 30°C. Protect from light. Keep out of reach of children.

- Disposal

Ask your pharmacist how to dispose of medicines no longer required.
