What ELOSONE LOTION is used for

ELOSONE LOTION is used to relief the inflammation and itching on the skin. These skin problems are responsive to corticosteroid.

How ELOSONE LOTION works

ELOSONE LOTION contains a medicine called Mometasone Furoate. It belongs to a group of medicines called corticosteroids. It has anti-inflammatory, anti-itching and blood vessel narrowing actions.

Ask your pharmacist or doctor if you have any questions about this medicine.

Before you use ELOSONE LOTION

-When you must not use it

Do not take ELOSONE LOTION if:

• You are hypersensitive to Mometasone Furoate, other corticosteroids or any components in this preparation.

-Before you start to use it

Tell your pharmacist or doctor if you have:

- infection on your skin and specify on the infected area.
- been using any other skin products.
- clouding of eye lens
- skin thinning
- diabetes
- increased eye pressure
- tuberculosis (bacterial infection that mainly affects the lungs)

Pregnancy and breast feeding:

Ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking this medicine if you are pregnant or breast-feeding.

Topical corticosteroids should not be used extensively in large amounts or for long periods in pregnant woman.

Topical corticosteroids should not be applied to the breasts prior to nursing.

-Taking other medicines

Tell your pharmacist or doctor if you are taking any other products (such as over the counter medicine, prescribed medicine and herbal products).

How to use ELOSONE LOTION

Always use ELOSONE LOTION exactly as your doctor or pharmacist has told you. You should check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure.

-How much to use

Apply a few drops of ELOSONE LOTION to the affected area, including scalp sites, once daily as directed by your doctor and pharmacist and massage it gently until the medication disappears.

-When to use it

Apply on the affected area once dry and clean.

-How long to use it

Consult with your doctor or pharmacist for the treatment period.

-If you forget to use it

If you forget to use your lotion at the right time, use it as soon as you remember, then carry on as before. Do not double the dos to catch up.

-If you use too much (overdose)

Steroid can pass through your skin. Too much of ELOSONE LOTION passing through skin can produce systemic effect such as adrenal gland suppression, manifestation of Cushing syndrome, high blood sugar level and presence of sugar in the urine.

If you suspect that you are overdosed, please consult your pharmacist or doctor. Bring any remaining medicine with you.

While you are using ELOSONE LOTION

-Things you must do

If you are about to start taking on any other new medicine, tell your pharmacist or doctor that you are using ELOSONE LOTION.

-Things you must not do

Do not use more than the recommended dose unless your doctor tells you to.

Do not apply into the eyes.

-Things to be careful of

Discontinue use if irritation or sensitivity reaction develops and consult the doctor.

Suitable precautions should be taken during prolonged treatment, when treating extensive body surface areas, when using the occlusive technique and when treating children (because of a larger skin surface area to bodyweight ratio).

Use of topical corticosteroids in children should be limited to the least amount compatible with an effective therapy. Long term corticosteroid therapy may interfere with growth and development of children.

Side effects

Like all medicines, ELOSONE LOTION can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

Reported local adverse reactions include abnormal sensation of the body, such as burning, itching follicle hair inflammation, acne and sign of skin thinning.

If you get any side effects, even those not mentioned in this leaflet, tell your doctor or pharmacist.

Storage and Disposal of ELOSONE LOTION

-Storage

Store below 30°C. Keep container well closed. Protect from light. Keep out of reach of children.

-Disposal

Dispose the medicine after the expiry date.

Consult your pharmacist on how to safely dispose of any medicines no longer required.

ELOSONE LOTION is a slightly viscous solution, available in 30ml plastic bottle.

-Active ingredients: Mometasone Furoate 0.1%w/w

Isopropyl Alcohol, Hydroxypropyl
Methylcelulose, Methylparaben,
Phosphoric Acid and Purified
Water.
