## What Oralmet Tablet is used for

Oralmet tablet is used to control the level of sugar in blood for Type 2 diabetes or non-insulin dependent diabetes mellitus patients.

#### **How Oralmet Tablet works**

When there is too much sugar in your blood and insulin produced by your body is not enough to extract sugar from your blood, Oralmet Tablet will help to increase your body sensitivity to insulin and helps your body to use the sugar in the normal way again.

# **Before you use Oralmet Tablet**

## When you must not take it:

Do not use Oralmet,

- 1. if you are allergic to metformin,
- 2. if you have recently had an heart attack or any other heart problems,
- 3. if you have liver or kidney problems,
- 4. if you are pregnant, planning to get pregnant or are breast feeding.

#### Before you start to take it:

Talk to your doctor before using Oralmet if the conditions below apply to you:

- 1. Acidity in blood increased (Ketoacidosis)
- 2. Bad infection, stress, trauma
- 3. Problem with kidneys
- 4. Problem with liver and thyroid
- 5. Problem with heart

6. Loss a lots of water from body

7. Addiction to alcohol

# Taking other medicine:

Some medicines may interact with Oralmet when taken together. These include:

- (a) Medicine which tend to produce high blood sugar such as corticosteroid, diuretics, thyroid products, nicotinic acid and etc.
- (b) Medicine can increase metformin concentration in blood, such as Furosemide.
- (c) Cationic medicines such as ranitidine, morphine, procainamide, trimethoprim and vancomycin.
- (d) Medicine that can increases peak and blood concentration of metformin such as Cimetidine.

#### **How to take Oralmet Tablet**

# How much to take it

The usual starting dose is 500 mg metformin hydrochloride three times a day, given during or after meals. If you are taking Oralmet Tablet 850mg, initially 850mg can be taken twice or three times daily. A slow increase of dose may improve gastrointestinal tolerability. The maximum recommended dose of metformin hydrochloride is 3 g daily. The doctor will decide your initial dose and maintenance dose depends on your condition.

#### When to take it

Oralmet can be taken with or after meals.

#### How long to take it

Refer to your pharmacist or doctor for advice.

# If you forget to take it

You need to take it immediately and do not take double dose to make up for a forgotten dose.

## If you take too much (overdose)

High overdose of metformin or concomitant risks may lead to lactic acidosis. Lactic acidosis is a medical emergency and must be treated in hospital.

## While you are using it

# Things you must do

Check for your diabetes regularly. Remember to continue your diet with a regular distribution of carbohydrate intake during the day. Overweight patients should continue their energy-restricted diet.

# Things you must not do

Do not take more than what your pharmacist or doctor prescribed

# Thinks to be careful of

Avoid consumption of alcohol and alcohol-containing medicinal product.

## **Side effects**

- 1. Nausea, anorexia and vomiting,
- 2. Absorption of Vitamin B12 may be impaired.
- 3. Weight loss.
